Sir,

As Central Government by notification, constituted a Commission, to be known as the National Commission for Homoeopathy, to exercise the powers conferred upon, and to perform the functions assigned to it, under NCH Act 2020. As per section 59 (2) of NCH Act, 2020, following has been stated:

“Notwithstanding the repeal of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act 1973, the educational and medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder: Provided that anything done or any action taken as regards the educational and medical standards and requirements under the enactment under repeal and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall be deemed to have been done or taken under the corresponding provision of this Act and shall continue in force accordingly unless and until superseded by anything or by any action taken under this Act”.

As per provision in the Act, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy has been constituted with the mandate to grant permission to the existing and new medical institution of Homoeopathy. Accordingly, it is to inform you that all the relevant documents submitted by your college in Part-1 proforma were examined by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board.

2. On careful consideration of the report, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board has arrived at the following conclusion:-

That the applicant has set up a Homoeopathic Medical College with the component of staff, infrastructure, equipment and instruments and other facilities where as the College has to take urgent and time bound steps to implement Minimum Standard Requirements of the Homoeopathy College and attached Hospital as prescribed by the National Commission for Homoeopathy for conducting BHMS course in Homoeopathy. The deficiencies observed are as follows.

A. Teaching faculty:

1. Dr. Srikrishna Kumar Singh, DHMS, Professor, Anatomy: Joined on 16.04.2016, age 63 years 07 month (DOB 05.11.1957), no document of re-employment provided.
2. Only two Guest faculties considered against the requirement of 12 GF teachers as no previous teaching experiences provided for the following Guest faculties
Dr. Amita Oinam, Anatomy, Guest Assistant Professor, Dr. Vikrant Saxena,

Physiology, Guest Assistant Professor, Dr. Anju Rathore, Organon, Guest Assistant Professor, Dr. SD Azmeer Lal, Pathology, Guest Assistant Professor, Dr. Ghanshyam Kalakar, F.M.T. Guest Assistant Professor, Dr. Subhash Chander Kumawat, POM, Guest Assistant Professor, Dr. Okram Jet Singh, Surgery, Guest Assistant Professor and Dr. Deepti Sharma, OBS & GYN, Guest Assistant Professor

B. Miscellaneous:

1. EPF/PF /ESI deductions of teachers, non-teaching staff & hospital staff – no proof of EPF/PF /ESI deduction provided.
2. Form-16 of only 14 teaching faculty provided, not provided for other staff, Form-16 not provided from TRACES portal.
3. After considering the provisions of section 12C (1) of Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 and HCC (MSR) Regulations, 2013, **Permission of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board is issued to Madhav Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital, Madhav Hills, Post Bharja, Tehsil-Pindwara, Opp. Banas River Bridge Toll, NH-27, Abu Road, Sirohi-307026, Rajasthan for continuing admissions in 1- BHMS course with intake capacity of 100 seats during the academic year 2021-22. The Principal is directed to fulfill the deficiencies within three months and an affidavit in this regard may be submitted to the Medical Assessment Board within a period of one week.**
4. All admissions in Under Graduate/Post graduate course shall be through NEET only. It is further informed that, minimum 15% of seats of the permitted intake capacity of BHMS course shall be treated as All India quota. The counseling for seats under All India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling Authority of State / UT Government as designated by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling Authority of that State / UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government for All India quota or the student admitted thereunder.
5. The category wise list of selected candidates may be informed to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy after the process of admission is completed. Any admissions carried out other than NEET qualified students will not be approved by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board as per rules.
6. The college has to comply with the full requirements of HCC (MSR) Regulations, 2013 for conducting the course. All deficiencies observed and mentioned above which affects the performance of the academic Institution, through which College fails to fulfill the statutory requirements, has to be rectified within three months time from issue of this permission letter. Compliance report shall be submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board accordingly. Subsequently, the Board shall verify the compliance well in time and may conduct Online/Physical inspection for verification of compliance as per the HCC (MSR) Regulation, 2013 and will consider admissions for the academic year 2022-23.

In reference to the CCH's letter No.15-5/2017-CCH(27)/22006 dated 07.11.2017 wherein a Letter of Intent was issued to the Registrar, Madhav University Pindwara, Sirohi, Rajasthan to start a New Homoeopathic Medical College in the name and style of Madhav Homeopathic Medical College and Hospital, Madhav Hills, Sirohi, Rajasthan, with 100 seats in BHMS course from the academic session 2018-19 subject to fulfillment of certain conditions, I am directed to say that after careful consideration of your proposal in terms of the provision of the HCC Act 1973, relevant regulations, inspection report of the CCH; permission of the Central Government is hereby granted to Registrar, Madhav University Pindwara, Sirohi, Rajasthan to start a New Homoeopathic Medical College in the name and style of Madhav Homeopathic Medical College and Hospital, Madhav Hills, Sirohi, Rajasthan with 100 seats in BHMS course from the academic session 2018-19 under the provision of the section 12A of the HCC Act 1973.

2. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teaching faculty, non-teaching staff, hospital staff and other requirements as per the provision of HCC (MSR), 2013; Regulations are in position before the admission of the first batch of students in the 1st professional BHMS course is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCH.

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3. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for 2nd, 3rd, and 4th BHMS course well in time as per the CCH norms which will be verified and reported by the CCH at least three months before the start of next professional and accordingly, the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be issued.
4. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 13(1) of the HCC Act, 1973 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
